## Coronavirus (COVID-19) update -

From Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> November until Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> December new lockdown rules mean that our churches may only open for funerals or individual prayer. The Archbishops of Canterbury and York are asking us to make this time of lockdown a month of prayer. They write: 'Bearing in mind our primary vocation as the Church of Jesus Christ to pray and to serve, we call upon the Church of England to make this month of lockdown a month of prayer. More than anything else, whatever the nation thinks, we know that we are in the faithful hands of the risen Christ who knows our weaknesses, tiredness and struggles and whose steadfast love endures for ever.

Above all we recall people to some of the fundamental spiritual disciplines that shape our Christian life. During this second lockdown we invite you to fast in a way appropriate to you, as well as pray for our nation every Thursday, for its leaders, its health, and essential services, and all those who suffer.

In one of the climactic passages of the New Testament, Paul says to those who follow Christ that their "love must be genuine, that they hate what is evil, and hold fast to what is good." He asks them to "serve the lord", exhorting them to "rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints; extend hospitality to strangers." (See Romans 12.9-12.) None of this is easy. Especially not at the moment. But it is our calling.' (*The Archbishops of Canterbury and York*)

All Saints Church, Chilvers Coton will be open for individual prayer every Sunday morning from 09.30-10.30.

St. Mary the Virgin Church, Astley will not open for services on Sunday afternoons however, anyone can visit the church for prayer on a Wednesday or Sunday by contacting the churchwardens or any member of the PCC.

It is hoped that we will be able to resume services in both churches in December.

We will continue to publish short reflections of the Bible readings each week. These will be available via e-mail, the church website, church Facebook pages, or by post to those without a computer or smart phone. If you are reading this and you are aware that we don't have up to date details of how you would like to be kept in touch, then please let Joanne in the Parish Office know how you would like to be contacted.
